Rabbinic Reflections

A colleague once told me that Shavuot is the best Jewish holiday nobody's heard of. I think this is true, but what an opportunity to miss! On Shavuot we can revisit the (real or imaginary) fun of college days. When else can we stay up all night with friends, eating cheesecake, ice cream and blintzes, and having cool intellectual conversations? A Tikkun Leil Shavuot always reminds me of the story in our Passover Haggadah when the students come to the rabbis (who have been discussing the Exodus from Egypt all night) and say, "Our Masters, the time has already come to recite the morning Sh'ma!"

Each year before Shavuot, I spend some time getting mentally ready to explore what Torah means in my life – essentially preparing to stand again at Sinai on Shavuot morning. Just as we prepare for a holiday, so must we prepare for other important occasions in our lives. Preparation is not just a checklist of tasks, though; it also means doing what we need to do to be mentally and emotionally prepared for what is coming.

We are all now preparing ourselves to move into a different phase of this pandemic. Although each of us will be on a different path as we journey forward, we are all journeying together. This can present some challenges. For example, we will not necessarily know what precautions someone else has taken (such as vaccination) and we will not necessarily know with whom they regularly come into contact. We won't know if someone has an underlying health condition that puts them at higher risk or if they have a family member in that situation. Each of us will have to evaluate what we feel comfortable with and what we do not feel comfortable with and accept those feelings. We must also recognize that others will not necessarily feel the same way that we do and accept their feelings. In short, we will have to get along with one another even when we do not agree or even understand each other's perspectives. Hmmm..... I think I have heard advice like that before....

LEARNING HOW TO GIVE

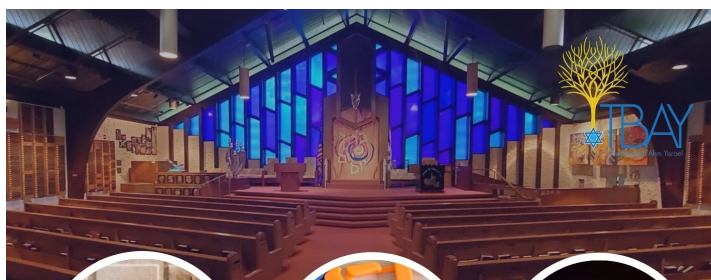
