As of the end of October, the program had a profit of \$6,454 with 119 membership units participating. We have sold more than \$125,000 in gift cards and stamps this fiscal year. Please keep in mind that TBAY makes a profit on every gift card and Forever Stamp sold through the program. The average profit is 5%. Also, please remember, especially during these very difficult economic times, the purchase of gift cards and discounted stamps remains a great way for you to support TBAY with no additional out-of-pocket expense.






