Rabbinic Reflections

Shalom TBAY!

It is hard to believe that we are already on the cusp of the year 5783!

5782 was certainly memorable. Rather than putting the COVID-19 pandemic behind us, this virus has shown us again and again that we need to learn to live with and – dare I say – manage it. As I have said to some of you, I feel that we are like passengers in an airplane. When the ride is smooth, we can get up and move about the cabin, but when the little turbulence light goes on, we return to our seats and put on our seatbelts. So, too, when we are hit with another surge or a new variant, we now know what we need to do: masks, distancing, outdoor activities and good airflow. As TBAY's president Brian Margulies said so eloquently last year, we have learned the fine art of knowing when to PIVOT! We are lucky to have a great

COVID Response Team, chaired by Eric Carniol, MD, that meets regularly to keep us safe and open and together.

Now that we have vaccines, boosters, better medical treatments, and a better understanding of how to decrease transmission, our challenge becomes mental, not just physical. How we perceive these mitigation efforts greatly affects our emotional well-being. A mask can be a setback that upsets us each time we put it on... or it can be a minor annoyance that we have to remember to bring with us to shul or to a store. Rabbi Rubin's Installation Remarks

Thank you all for joining us for this very special Shabbat on this very special weekend. It is exciting to be a part of the beginning of a new chapter together here at TBAY. I am so honored and humbled to be stepping into the role as your Rabbi formally now, after two years of being part of the TBAY family. When I first walked in the door to TBAY, I felt like I had come home. I met you on Erev Purim, only days before everything shut down. In those first few hours, meeting the Search Committee and many Board members and enjoying the fun and energy of the Hamilton Purim Spiel, I became so excited at the prospect of being in this place. And then, as we walked through the early months of the pandemic together, we learned that TBAY is much more than a place. It is a *kehillah kedosha* – a holy community. A community is not defined by walls or a building but by people and relationships. Together we have faced the challenges of lockdowns, of transitioning to online and then multi-access services, of riding the roller coaster of the waves of COVID variants and needing to modify our protocols accordingly time and time again.

Our world is drastically different than it was only three years ago. Whoever could have imagined the challenges that we have faced together? And yet, difficult though they were (and still are!), we have learned from them. They have brought us together in new ways. They have opened doors to acceptance and inclusion that were previously closed. They have taught us that we can be flexible and resilient. They have shown us the value of community and the importance of what we bring to it. And they have reminded us that each and every person is important. The words from Pippin, “The whole is greater than the sum of the parts it’s made of” were never so true as they are here and today. TBAY is filled with people who genuinely care about each other. No wonder we have continued to thrive.

An installation is a very special time in the life of a synagogue and in the life of a Rabbi. And what do you know, in this week’s Torah portion, God commands Moses to tell the Jewish people:

אַלֵיְהֶם מוֹעֲדֵי יְהוָה
aleihem moadei Adonai - these are God’s appointed times.

Our Torah then specifies the holy times we are to celebrate: Shabbat, Pesach, Shavuot, Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur and Sukkot—each one is to be a day of complete rest, a day on which “you shall do no work.” But in sanctifying time through the holidays, we are also sanctifying our relationships with one another, for the word *moeid* means more than just time. The *Ohel Moeid* in our Torah refers to the Tent of Meeting, the place where Moses goes to be with God. So *aleihem moadei Adonai* can also be interpreted as God’s appointed relationships. Our holidays are not just times to be observed, but

opportunities for our relationships with one another to be celebrated and strengthened. And just as our sages found the word *eid* – witness – hidden in the Sh’ma, so too can we find the word *eid* hidden in the word *moadei*. So, in our holidays, in our gatherings, in our communities, we are also witnesses. Our Torah is telling us to show up for God, but just as importantly, to show up for each other, both collectively and individually. We do that here at TBAY, in spades.

I have so many people to thank tonight. If I mentioned every person who has been part of this journey, we would be here for another hour, so if I don’t give you a shout out right now, please know that you are important to me and I thank you for what you have brought to my life.

We are all blessed to have this vibrant community at Temple Beth Ahm Yisrael. We are lucky to have an active, committed and highly functional Board led now by Brian Margulies and before by Lesley Brooks and Ilene Shewitz and by many people before them. Thank you for the many hours you give to ensuring this is a home for all of us, now and in the future. We are lucky to have a plethora of volunteers, in too many committees and activities to name, who never seem to slow down. A special shout-out to our Installation Weekend Committee, led by Debbie Nadel. You have amazed me with your excitement, enthusiasm and hard work to make this weekend so wonderful for so many people. Thank you for making me feel so special. We are lucky to have a dedicated and skilled staff: Harvey, Maxine and Soraya in the office, Ann and Gigi and the teachers in the Religious School, Sandi and Kendra and the ECP teachers and of course, Rodrigo caring for our beautiful building. Thank you for making it a joy to work here. We are lucky to enjoy the musical talents of Ben Rosenbach and Larry Indik, our many daveners, both for morning minyan and Shabbat, our Cantor Emeritus Richard Nadel, Rabbi Simon Rosenbach, and of course the very active engagement and mentorship of our Rabbi Emeritus Rabbi Mark Mallach. Thank you for your partnership and your friendship. I am well aware that not every community is so blessed with such extraordinary leadership and involvement.

I am grateful to know so many TBAY members who find value in our (kosher) buffet of the various aspects of synagogue life, from services to Men’s Club and Women’s League, to social events and *tikkun olam*, to adult education, Religious School and the ECP. I thank you for all you give and for who you are. You have helped me grow into the Rabbi and the person I am today. 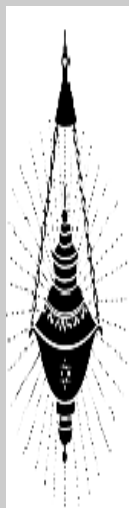

CARING COMMITTEE

In times of tragedy or distress, friends need each other. You may wonder, 'What should I say?' 'What can I do?' Here are suggestions:

Sit with your friend. Sometimes the simple act of sitting in close proximity can be comforting. Your role is to bear witness to your friend's pain, not to offer magic words to take it away.

Try not to worry about saying the wrong thing. Keep it simple. Walk with your friend. The stress of trauma or grief can be physically debilitating. Take your friend by the hand and walk, if possible. Breathe together. Again, no words are necessary.

Your closeness is a comfort. You are there for your friend. Don't talk about your own physical ailments and concerns.

Validate your friend's feelings and worries. At the same time, reflect optimism and

hope for his or her recovery. Try to make him or her laugh. Make a meal. Home-cooked meals are particularly welcome.

Know when to get help. If your friend is unable to drink, eat or sleep and you are concerned about his or her health, encourage him or her to call the doctor. Medical attention may be necessary.

Stay for the long haul. Many people offer help at the time of crisis. A true friend still comes by one month, six months, or a year later.

It is a wonderful mitzvah to perform *bikkur cholim*, visiting the sick. No one should feel alone during a time of illness, physical, mental, or spiritual.

From Our Executive Director

BEYNEINU – JUST BETWEEN US

I'm excited!

As you read this, we're actively preparing the building for the High Holy Days. They'll be different than in years past but will incorporate many familiar elements of TBAY holidays of years before COVID was a part of our daily lives plus many elements that renew the fresh and positive changes first initiated during our COVID experience.

For example, last year we introduced in-person services in a tent in the field behind our building. We employed a professional tent rigging company to set up a 2,700 sq. ft. tent, rented ~200 chairs and engaged the services of professional audio to provide 'studio quality' sound throughout the Holy Days. We also had a pre-recorded service that was broadcast to the rest of our community who did not wish to attend in person, and that was available via computers over YouTube Live Streaming. That was good, but we wanted to do better!

This year, it is our intention to offer 'something for everyone' simultaneously giving the same, shared experience to both in person and remote service participants. We'll have a larger tent (this time ~4,000 sq. ft.) with socially-distanced seating for about 250 participants for Rosh Hashanah Day 1 and Yom Kippur Day services. We'll again have a professional audio company provide studio quality sound to those in

attendance and we'll simultaneously broadcast those services via Zoom and YouTube Live Stream to those among us unable to attend in person. In real time, everyone will share in the beautiful services led by Rabbi Rubin and Cantorial Soloist, Larry Indik.

Rosh Hashanah Day 2 and Erev Yom Kippur (Kol Nidre) will be held indoors in the main sanctuary and will also be simulcast via our in-house system over Zoom and YouTube so again, everyone can share in the same experience whether you are in the building or at home.

Please watch your emails and US Mails for more information and updates as they become available. Like last year, should the prevailing medical conditions change, we are prepared to 'pivot' and offer fully remote services, if the need arises.

As I said at the top, I'm excited to be part of this creative process that melds the traditional with the new so that all of us can share the warmth of the Holy Days together as one community whether in person or remotely, whether at TBAY or from our homes.

From my family to yours, may the coming year be one of sweetness, health, happiness and joy for you and your loved ones!



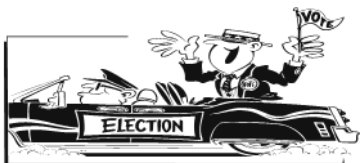

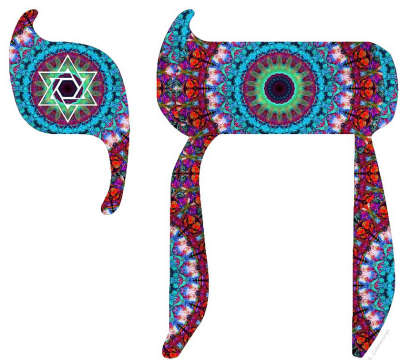

Some changes are: Staff will be wearing masks at all times, visitors are limited to a strict time frame while within the building, carpool lines for both drop off and pick up, increased sanitizing of touch points, toys and furniture, and limited class sizes.

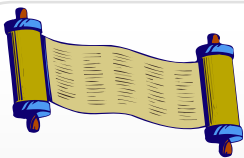
ATTENTION PARENTS OF K-3

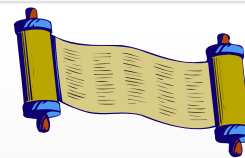

Message From Women's League Presidium

...one mitzvah generates another... the reward for a mitzvah is another mitzvah (Pirkei Avot: 4:2)

The spiritual benefits of our ethical/religious behavior are incalculable and have been shown to have physical benefits for us as well.

May you find reward in endeavoring to elevate your life through mitzvot. And may this New Year be a year of renewal for yourselves, and your loved ones.
