This concert is dedicated to the memory of Miriam and Nahum Gershwin, founding members of Temple Beth Ahm Yisrael. By telling their story of devotion, resilience, perseverance and love for Jewish learning, we connect the past to the future and inspire present and future generations.

Miriam and Nahum Gershwin met and married in the Kovno Ghetto. Forced to become prisoners at the Stutthof and Dachau Concentration Camps, they both miraculously survived Holocaust atrocities and were ultimately reunited in Munich. With the help of Miriam's uncle who resided in Springfield, they immigrated to the U.S. in 1949 with their son and Miriam's father, settled in Springfield, and later had a daughter. Their family grew to include a daughter-in-law, son-in-law, 6 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren.

Miriam and Nahum were instrumental in TBAY's early success. Miriam was one of our original Religious School teachers and helped found our Sisterhood. Nahum was a lay leader, Gabbai and formative Board member. We are grateful for the legacy they have given us.
